Background ↗

Climate change

is affecting lives globally, with severe consequences for human life, ecosystems, communities, and the economy. In India, climate change adaptation efforts are progressing with its integration into National Policies and Programmes. India's Nationally Determined Commitments (NDCs) focus on reducing climate risks for vulnerable groups and sectors, with strong emphasis on increased financing instruments for adaptation in Agriculture and Water sectors as well as in the Himalayan region, Coastal areas, and the Indo-Gangetic plains.

On behalf of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH is implementing the Indo-German development cooperation project 'Climate Adaptation, Resilience and Climate Finance in Rural India (CAFRI II)' in close cooperation with the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC), Government of India, and the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD). The project emphasizes efficient localization through cross-sectoral

coordination, partner engagement, and capacity building at all levels of governance. Sectoral focus is on the topics of agriculture and Water in rural India.

Within this framework of CAFRI II, GIZ is providing technical support to the Directorate of Environment in Uttar Pradesh (UP) in implementing Sustainable Agriculture & Jal Jeevan Mission under UP-SAPCC (2021-30). This aligns with the agreed-upon commitment with the MoEFCC to concentrate efforts in Uttar Pradesh on providing technical support to facilitate execution of selected initiatives under the

Water & Agriculture Missions of UPSAPCC 2.0, specifically in the Bundelkhand region.

Towards this, capacity building of relevant government institutions, as well as the vulnerable ecosystems is central to enhancing resilience in seven districts within the Bundelkhand region of Uttar Pradesh through a range of awareness, capacity development and outreach events helping them to plan and implement risk informed developmental interventions, as per the mandates of Agriculture and Water Missions of UPSAPCC.



The Bundelkhand Region

The impact of climate change on Agriculture & allied and Water sectors in Bundelkhand has been profound, with erratic rainfall, extended droughts, depleting groundwater levels, increased soil degradation and degraded ecosystems, severely affecting crop productivity and water availability. These changes have disrupted traditional farming practices, leading to declining incomes and heightened vulnerabilities for rural communities, especially small and marginal and woman farmers, dependent on agriculture-based livelihoods.

Agriculture (and allied) and Water sectors are crucial for livelihood security and poverty eradication of the marginalized communities. Hence, climate risk informed planning and programme implementation is needed for Agriculture and Water sectors, most importantly at District, Block and Gram Panchayat levels.

Mainstreaming Climate risk in district panchayat development plans

Article 243 of Constitution provides the opportunity of three levels of developmental planning viz District, Block and Gram Panchayat levels. District Development Planning is quite important in this process, which addresses the needs and priorities of various Gram Panchayats and locks in the district. District level developmental plans are crucial as financial resources of 15th Finance Commission is also allocated at district level. District Plans are expected to be developed with relevant stakeholders in a participatory manner. In the context of disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation, the district level developmental planning is quite important as it can address the priorities based on district development indicators and assessed climate vulnerabilities.

Towards mainstreaming climate risks, orientation workshops (half-day each) were conducted by Gorakhpur Environmental Action Group (GEAG) on relevance, need and guidelines for risk informed and gender responsive District Panchayat Development Plans in Chitrakoot, Banda, Mahoba, Jhansi, Lalitpur, Jalaun and Hamirpur districts of Bundelkhand region.

The main objectives of the orientation workshops were:

- Introducing climate vulnerability of the district particularly, related to Water and Agriculture sectors, as per UPSAPCC, with special emphasis on the vulnerabilities of rural women in these sectors
- Orientation on need to mainstream climate risk in Livelihood and Development (SRLM and PRI) and its scope
- Proposed plan for orientation at Block and GP levels and needed support



Orientation workshops in Seven districts

With the above background, orientation workshops were held in all the seven districts of Bundelkhand, namely, Chitrakoot, Mahoba, Banda, Hamirpur, Jalaun, Jhansi and Lalitpur as per the following schedule:

Climate Profile of the Districts:

The climate profile of the Bundelkhand region (Banda, Chitrakoot, Hamirpur, Jalaun, Jhansi, Lalitpur & Mahoba) shows a highly climate-stressed zone, marked by rising heat, shrinking rainfall, and unstable monsoon patterns. While each district exhibits distinct vulnerabilities, a common pattern emerges: increasing temperatures, weakening rainfall, and growing water insecurity impacting agriculture and livelihoods.

1. Temperature Pattern: Steady Warming and Intensifying Heat Stress

Across all districts, average maximum temperatures hover around 32.3–32.7°C and minimum temperatures around 18.5–19.1°C, but a critical threat is the consistent warming trend:

- Maximum temperatures are rising at +0.01°C/year (Lalitpur rising fastest at 0.02°C/year).
- Minimum temperatures are rising faster at +0.02°C/year in most districts (warm nights worsening).
- Declining Diurnal Temperature Range (DTR) (–0.01°C/year) across all districts indicates faster warming of nights.

Even “lower-exposure” districts like Banda (110 days) and Jalaun (103 days) face heat levels far above national rural averages.

3 Rainfall Pattern: Shrinking Monsoons, Declining Non-Monsoon Support

All districts depend heavily on monsoon rainfall (80–95%). However:

- Annual rainfall is declining everywhere (–2.4 mm to –10.52 mm/year).
- Monsoon rainfall shows the steepest declines, especially in Hamirpur (–6.14 mm/year) & Jalaun (–9.35 mm/year).
- Post-monsoon rainfall, crucial for groundwater recharge, is declining sharply in Banda, Hamirpur, Jalaun & Lalitpur.

Extreme Rainfall Events

- ↳ **Lalitpur & Mahoba** show **increasing heavy rainfall days**, causing surface run-off, flash floods, and poor recharge (due to rocky terrain).
- ↳ **Jalaun & Jhansi** have **very low extreme rainfall events**, meaning fewer recharge opportunities.

3. Overall Climate Vulnerability: District Patterns

District	Dominant Climate Stress
Jhansi	Extreme heat + fast rainfall decline
Lalitpur	Rapid warming + intense heavy rain (runoff)
Jalaun	Severe rainfall shortage + drying trend
Hamirpur	High heat + monsoon collapse
Mahoba	High heat stress + heavy rainfall variability
Banda	Rising minimum temperatures + post-monsoon drying
Chitrakoot	Declining monsoon + warming nights

In response to these climatic conditions, the Uttar Pradesh State Action Plan on Climate Change (UPSAPCC 2021-2030) has been formulated at the state level to address climate change impacts. The plan focuses on eight missions, and under these sectors, 41 strategies and 187 actions have been identified.

Need and Perspectives to Integrate Climate Risks into Development Plans

During the workshops, it was discussed that the increasing frequency and intensity of climate-related disasters due to ongoing climate change can seriously affect present and future development plans. Therefore, it is now essential to integrate climate risks into development schemes so that potential losses can be minimized.

In this context, discussions were held on climate-resilient measures for the Agriculture sector such as weather-based advisory services, micro-irrigation, crop diversification, and soil and water conservation

practices. It was also emphasized that the active participation of women and local communities is crucial for inclusive and sustainable development.

The participants strongly highlighted the need to document traditional knowledge and adopt modern technologies to ensure climate-resilient agriculture and efficient water management.

While discussing adaptation strategies for climate risks in Agriculture and Water sectors, the following key measures were identified as priorities:

- ↳ Crop diversification
- ↳ Soil and land management
- ↳ Soil health improvement
- ↳ Use of organic inputs
- ↳ Adoption of crop rotation
- ↳ Utilization of locally available natural resources

Additionally, focus should be given to supportive livelihood activities such as animal husbandry, dairy, fish farming, and kitchen gardening, which can help strengthen the rural economy.

For water management, climate-resilient strategies such as rainwater harvesting, construction of check dams, farm ponds, and micro-irrigation systems (drip and sprinkler) were recognized as crucial for resilient agriculture and effective water conservation.

Risk-informed District Development Panchayat Plans

Integrating climate-resilient practices into local development plans can play a crucial role in reducing disaster risks, building resilience, and sustaining agricultural productivity. Implementing such measures ensures food security, water availability, and livelihood stability for rural communities.

In the light of the above, it was discussed in the workshops that it is essential to promote risk-sensitive and climate-adaptive Panchayat development plans, particularly in schemes related to water and agriculture, with a special emphasis on ensuring the participation of women. Panchayats should also ensure the sustainable use of available natural resources and adopt inclusive and participatory implementation processes to achieve equitable and long-lasting development outcomes.

It is essential to integrate climate concerns into Agriculture and Water Resources sectors in the formulation of DPDP (District Panchayat Development Plan) in a holistic manner to ensure food security, enhance farmers' income, and promote ecological sustainability.

Key strategies for integrating climate concerns in Agriculture Sector:

- **Crop Diversification:** Choose crops according to local water availability and market demand, including Pulses, oilseeds, millets, vegetables, and high-value crops
- **Promoting water-efficient, climate-resilient farming practices:** Enhance adoption of climate-resilient agriculture in dryland areas.

- **Soil health improvement:** Promote soil nutrient management based on soil health cards and encourage organic, climate-smart, and zero-budget natural farming
- **Water-efficient irrigation technologies:** Scale up the use of Drip irrigation, Sprinkler systems, Micro-irrigation
- **Value Chain Development:** Strengthen the rural agriculture value chain through Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), cold storage & warehousing, E-market linkages

Key strategies for integrating climate concerns in Water Resources Sector:

- Water Conservation and Management: **Promote Field-level water harvesting structures like** Farm bunding, check dams, infiltration tanks, percolation pits, and contour bunding
- **Revival of Water Bodies:** Desilting and rejuvenation of **ponds, wells, and rivers**, and increasing their storage capacity and effectiveness.
- **Soil–Water Management: Water budgeting at village level**, and aligning crop planning with available water resources.
- **Climate-Smart Land & Water Use: Diversification of irrigation sources** and promoting efficient and sustainable water utilization.

Building the capacity of women farmers and self-help groups (SHGs) helps improve rural livelihoods, strengthens local economies, and supports social empowerment. Inclusive development planning enhances climate adaptation and disaster risk reduction, making communities more resilient and self-reliant.

Key Discussion Points Emerged in the Workshop

During the open discussion, the following key points emerged:

- ↘ The need to connect ponds with streams and to revive old water bodies.
- ↘ Training for youth and women farmers on water conservation and agricultural schemes.
- ↘ Enhancement of coordination between departments and formation of a District-level Team for climate risk management.
- ↘ Restoration of natural river-drainage systems and promotion of micro-irrigation.
- ↘ Strengthening local resource-based employment and market linkages.
- ↘ Integrated role of agriculture and livestock and the importance of indigenous breeds and traditional practices
- ↘ Due to sudden heavy rainfall, drought, and hailstorms, the workload and climate stress on women is increasing.
- ↘ There is a rising need for rural water security, water conservation, and water management.
- ↘ Participation of women in decision-making processes at the Panchayat and community levels is essential.
- ↘ Promote water access for low-water-consuming crops and communities.
- ↘ Focus on afforestation and construction of check-dams, to be mandatorily included in GPDP (Gram Panchayat Development Plan).
- ↘ Ensure Gram Pradhans, community members, and related stakeholders are sensitized and trained so that actionable measures from SAPCC (State Action Plan on Climate Change) can be integrated into district planning.
- ↘ Participants strongly emphasized involving local Panchayat leaders and government departments in climate-resilient planning.
- ↘ Finally, all participants agreed that in the entire Bundelkhand region, it is crucial to protect "Farmer–Youth–Water," i.e., Fasal, Yuva, and Jal, and all agencies must work together with the same approach.

These discussions clearly highlighted that the challenges related to water and agriculture in rural areas can be addressed only through Community participation, active involvement of women and effective implementation of government schemes
